Recovery from the COVID-19 Pandemic

- Since we met for last annual conference in May of 2022, much work has returned to a pre-pandemic baseline
- Vaccines for Children (VFC) and Immunization Quality Improvement Program (IQIP) Provider site visits are on-track
- Immunization rates are continuing to increase, though we still have areas to improve upon
- Our Immunization Information System, PhilaVax is more robust, with better data quality
- Establishing new and stronger partnerships



Immunization Information System Stats

- 35,522,474 vaccines in the system
- 4,490,965 patients in the system
- 1,208 active providers reporting to the system
- Over 452,000 vaccines were ordered via the IIS, valued at over \$32 million
- Interoperable with 6 other jurisdictions including, NY State, NJ, DE, CT, OK, NV and the Veteran's Affairs
- We also regularly exchange data with PA




The National Immunization Surveys (NIS) are a group of telephone surveys used to monitor vaccination coverage among children and teens.




NIS - Teen

- Overall, Philadelphia has some of the highest teen immunization rates in the country.
- However, we are still missing the mark on HPV UTD, the Healthy People 2030 target is 80%



The 2019 birth cohort is considered preliminary because it includes responses from parents/guardians surveyed in 2020 and 2021 only. The cohort will be finalized after responses from survey year 2022 can be included.

Partnerships

Partnerships

- Created an Adult Collaborative with community organizations, we are holding bimonthly calls to engage in conversation around adult immunization
- Funding 15 community-based organizations to do vaccine promotion work in the community, some of whom will present more on this work later
- Working with our Maternal, Child, Family Health Division to create training programs to educate workers who go into homes and work with families with young children
- Worked with the School District of Philadelphia to create some back-to-school resources for providers
- Attended 11 health fairs this summer and distributed over 2,500 information packets on immunization to community members



Migrant Welcome Center

- In May 2022, Philadelphia received its first transport of asylum seekers, PDPH, along with other key stakeholders, coordinated a mass care response to provide shelter, medical care, and other essential services
- Immunization Program offered Varicella vaccine weekly
- Held a back-to-school clinic for children residing at the center on 8/29
- Provided 78 vaccines to 18 children to prepare them for backto-school



Ukrainian Refugee Project

- Partnering with Catholic Social Services to provide vaccines to the Ukrainian refugees.
- The Vax (U) Kraine project is expected to launch by the end of October.
- Providing Polio, COVID, MMR, and Flu vaccines to uninsured adults




Shelters Team

- Immunization Program continues to partner with Preparedness Program to offer vaccine to unhoused persons
- Team has hosted 42 clinics in 2023
- Administered 859 vaccine in 2023, which includes COVID-19, Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, Flu, and Mpox vaccine







PDPH Homeless Outreach Team January-March 2023 Report

Community Flu Program

- Annually run community flu program to vaccinate uninsured adults where they feel most comfortable- in their community
- We partner with approximately 20-25 organizations
- Host over 100 clinics from September through December
- Typically vaccinate around 1,000-1,500 persons



COVID-19 Vaccine

COVID-19/Bridge Access Program

- COVID-19 is fully commercialized
- Vaccines for Children (VFC) enrolled sites are required to order and administer COVID-19 vaccine as they would any other vaccine on the schedule
- To ensure access for uninsured/underinsured adults we are also offering the Bridge Access Program
- Sites can enroll in the program to continue to supply COVID-19 vaccine
- Goal is to create broad access

RSV Immunization Implementation

- VFC Program is working to offer nirsevimab this fall to all VFC sites and to birthing hospitals to protect infants entering their first RSV season
- Older adult RSV vaccine is not currently available through the VFC or Vaccines for Adults at Risk (VFAAR) Program
- RSV vaccine for pregnant people will be added to the VFC Program in the coming weeks
